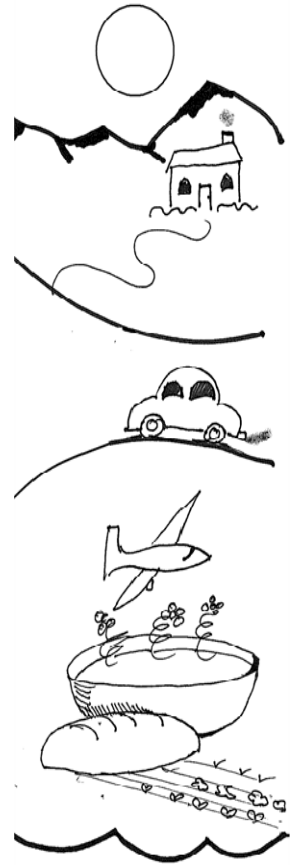

Rules of the Auction

- **Pre-auction bids** may be submitted up until October 21, 9 p.m. by leaving a message with Janet Pfeffer (410-770-9540; jpfeffer@goeaston.net). Tell her the highest price you are willing to pay, and the person who bids for you will get you the best deal.
- Sometimes an item will be offered more than once. The auctioneer will take bids until the highest price is reached. It will then be announced how many items are available; negotiations may occur to strike the best deal for UUFE. In the event of confusion, the decision of the auctioneer is final.
- Keep track of your winning bids and pay for your purchases at the end of the auction. A volunteer accountant will take your check before you depart.
- Many items will be offered in a silent auction. You may write down your bids for the silent auction items between 7:00 and 7:45 p.m. The winners will be announced at the beginning of the live auction.
- The purchaser is responsible for contacting the donor to arrange for delivery of the services. Contact the donor soon to arrange for delivery within 12 months. If the purchaser is unable to obtain the service, through no fault of his or her own, a credit toward next year's Service Auction purchases may be requested from the Auction Chairperson.
- **Submit "late breaking extras"** by calling Janet at 410-770-9540 or e-mailing at jpfeffer@goeaston.net **before 10 p.m. Wednesday, October 20** giving item name, description, value and minimum bid, along with your name and phone.
